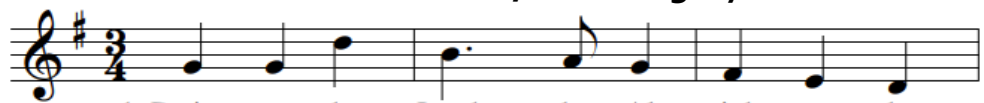


Preparation of the Gifts: "The Servant Song"




