A reading from the Book of Exodus (17:3-7)

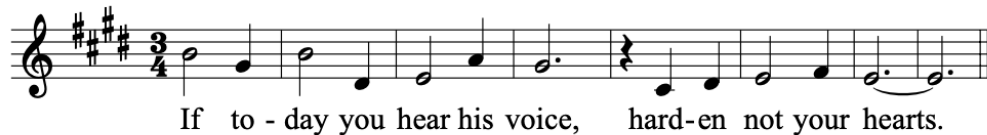
