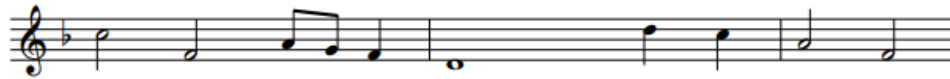

### Nicene Creed
