MUSIC & LITURGY: FROM THE DESK OF MARY ELLEN HAUPERT

THE THEOLOGY OF SACRED SPACE

Worship styles are nuanced by sacred space, which is an interesting consideration since the merger of Roncalli Newman and Blessed Sacrament parishes. The architecture for both churches is very different – and a fact worthy of reflection. Roncalli Newman's church "in the round" and floor tile scripture citations (which were chosen for Newman's campus ministry mission - "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" from Mark's Gospel and "Teacher, I will follow you wherever you go" from Luke's), not to mention a revolving altar, are unique among the churches in La Crosse. Most of the churches in the Diocese of La Crosse, including Blessed Sacrament Parish, were designed with long naves (where the congregation sits) which direct one's attention to the sanctuary (which holds the tabernacle and altar).

Roncalli Newman Center was built under the leadership of Msgr. Anthony Wagener, who was also pastor of BSP at the time. He began his plan for a new building with the more conventional "long-naved" church design described above. The plan shifted to one for a round space somewhere along the line, making it a space like the early church in Philippi. One of our former pastors suspected "that a Catholic worship space in-the-round hadn't been built in the previous thousand years." It was meant to make a statement, in the same way that it was meant to shape us…and to say something about us…and about how we perceive God.

How is God reflected in church architecture? Consider the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman (which was consecrated within a couple of years of Roncalli Newman Parish). The architecture of the Cathedral says that God is big, transcendent, distant, and magnificent. The architecture of Roncalli Newman, however, says that God is found in the human, the intimate, the close, the unadorned, the small. Now what the Cathedral and Roncalli Newman say about God (and us) are both true. God is both big, transcendent, distant, and magnificent, while also desiring to be intimate and close with all of us.

If you are a parishioner at Roncalli Newman or Blessed Sacrament, what aspects of the church enhance your worship? If you worship at both parishes, does the architecture reflect either transcendency or intimacy? Do statements like, "We shape our buildings; they shape us" and "There are no holy places without holy people" hold true for you? This might be a worthy discussion for members of both parishes!

A Minute with Jesus
