MUSIC & LITURGY: FROM THE DESK OF MARY ELLEN HAUPERT

Q & A Generated from the Survey

Thank you to the almost 150 BSP and RNP parishioners who completed both paper and electronic versions of the Liturgical Ministry and Outreach Survey. All the data has been organized into spreadsheets and sent to parish staff and volunteer coordinators for organizing their respective ministries and recruiting new members. In the weeks leading to my retirement, I'll do my best to make full use of the information you supplied, and attempt to answer some of your questions.

Worship Aid or Hymnal?

Regarding the worship aid, the survey asked parishioners if they were very satisfied, somewhat satisfied, somewhat dissatisfied, and very dissatisfied. 75.9% of BSP and RNP parishioners were very satisfied, 14.7% were somewhat satisfied, 8.6% somewhat dissatisfied, and .9% were very dissatisfied. When BSP merged with RNP last summer, Father Billy Dodge made the choice for a worship aid so that Newman parishioners (who were down to one Mass/weekend) might feel more at home at Blessed Sacrament. One year later, the majority of those who worship at BSP and RNP are very satisfied. Some of the points making a case for hymnal use were evangelization, catechesis, and clarity – all worthy of discussion as we move forward...

Q & A Generated from the Survey

Worship Aid or Hymnal?

Regarding the worship aid, the survey asked parishioners if they were very satisfied, somewhat satisfied, somewhat dissatisfied, and very dissatisfied. 75.9% of BSP and RNP parishioners were very satisfied, 14.7% were somewhat satisfied, 8.6% somewhat dissatisfied, and .9% were very dissatisfied. When BSP merged with RNP last summer, Father Billy Dodge made the choice for a worship aid so that Newman parishioners (who were down to one Mass/weekend) might feel more at home at Blessed Sacrament. One year later, the majority of those who worship at BSP and RNP are very satisfied. Some of the points making a case for hymnal use were evangelization, catechesis, and clarity – all worthy of discussion as we move forward.

Newman had this discussion 20 years ago. When I was hired as Roncalli Newman Parish's music director, I was told they had always used a worship aid, so there was no avoiding the weekly duties of generating one for Sunday Masses. I was encouraged to explore repertoire from all the major Catholic publishing houses, which included selections from GIA Publications, Oregon Catholic Press, and World Library Publications. Having the liberty to choose from a variety of different publishers didn't quelling the question of "Why don't we save a few trees?" – prompting a study considering the use of hymnals. Liturgy Committee advised that we retain the worship aid in order to explore a wider variety of repertoire, not to mention using 100% of what's printed. Our pastor supported that choice.

Blessed Sacrament was using the softcover "Word & Song," which is a subscription-based resource that contains both Sunday and weekday readings for each liturgical year, Roman Missal prayers, as well hundreds of musical selections. The parish reused plastic covers when the new shipment arrived in time for the First Sunday of Advent. The resource is excellent, but it is also expensive (\$18.50/copy). I'm sure that orders by volume offer financial savings, but even half of the sticker shock ($\$18.50 \times 300 = \$5,550/\text{year} \times 2$) is more than we can bear right now. On average, it costs about \$1,500.00 annually to produce 350 worship aids each weekend; this includes paper, copier expense, and copyright permission.

For now, we can be confident that the majority of people are very satisfied with the worship aid, and that we are complying with the pastor's instruction. Some people prepare for Mass with a subscription (i.e. GIVE US THIS DAY), or attending Mary Kerrigan's Sunday Scripture Study on Monday evening's at 7:00 PM in Bartl Lounge (lower level – RNP). I would also recommend visiting The Center for Liturgy at St. Louis University website (<https://liturgy.slu.edu/index.html>), which contains readings and commentary to guide you. A worship aid or hymnal isn't going to change your experience at Mass; only you and Christ Jesus can do that.

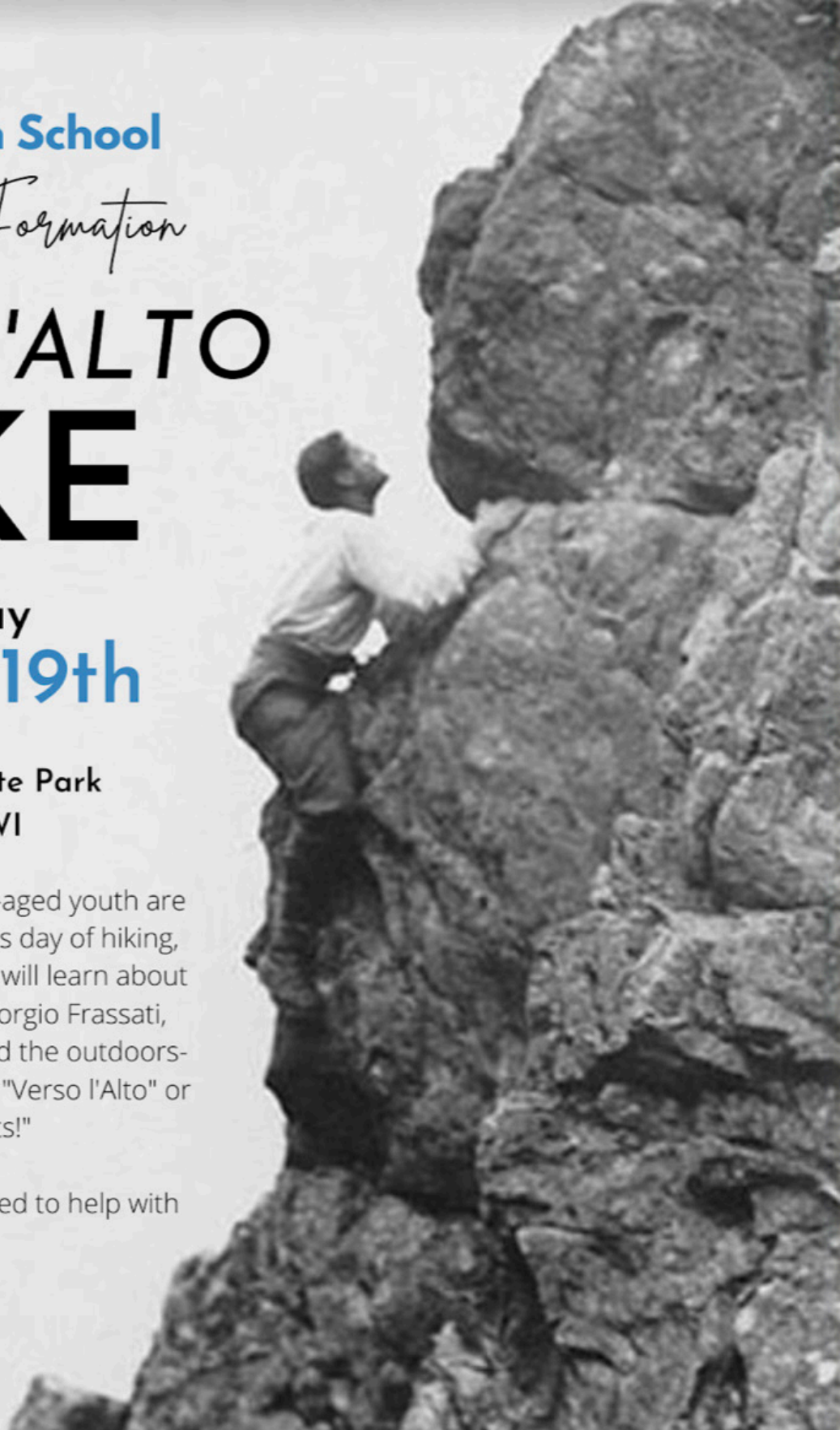
