### March Food Drive

- Thank you for your generosity to the March food drive. The amount of food collected totaled 629 pounds, which included 74 pounds of certified gluten free items. Monetary donations from both parishes totaled approximately \$4000 to help stock several food pantries in the area.

Outline of Notes for Hosea's Heart Meeting - April 5th:

- 1. Nancy Soldner will contact Jeff Reinhart about possible geranium plants for the Plant Sale
  - a.Nancy will contact Sign Pro about the cost of a canvas banner to be used to announce the Plant Sale Banner would hang on the BS School fence facing Losey Blvd.
